



Pseudopartitive Constructions in Romance and Germanic Contact Varieties

PhD project 2019-2022

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1. Research Question(s) and Topics

Overall research question:

How is pseudopartitivity expressed in Galloromance, Iberoromance, and Swiss German with a focus on language contact?

Aims, topics, and expected output:

- Syntactic distribution and morphosyntactic features of pseudopartitives
- The role of horizontal and vertical language contact: synchronic variation (and diachronic development)
- Different data collection methods and experiments
 - Comparison of their output: methodological conclusions

2. State of the Art

Pseudopartitives (Selkirk 1977):

- Noun phrases with two nominals which refer to "an amount of some substance" (cf. Koptjevskaja-Tamm 2006; 2009):
 - First nominal: quantifies over the second nominal, denotes an indefinite subset
 - Second nominal: "a kind of entity", denotes an indefinite superset of a substance

Partitive and pseudopartitive constructions:

French:

(1)	<i>une bouteille de ce vin</i>	partitive construction
(2)	<i>une bouteille de vin</i>	pseudopartitive construction

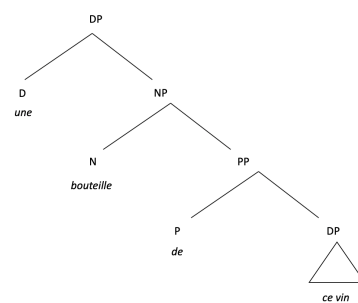


Figure 1: The syntactic structure of partitives (cf. Stickney 2004; Rutkowski 2007)

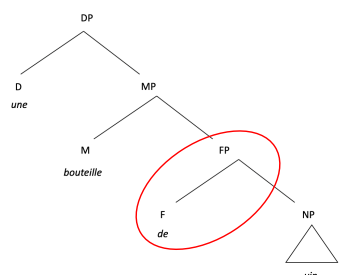


Figure 2: The syntactic structure of pseudopartitives (cf. Stickney 2004; Rutkowski 2007)

Unmarked Variants

Standard languages:

(3) fr.	<i>une bouteille de vin</i>	<i>un peu de vin</i>	construction marker
(4) sp.	<i>una botella de vino</i>	<i>un poco de vino</i>	
(5) ger.	<i>eine Flasche Wein</i>	<i>ein bisschen ø Wein</i>	juxtaposition
	'a bottle of wine'	'a bit of wine'	

Marked Variants

Examples:

Juxtaposition (lack of construction marker *de*):

(6) sp. *Si quiere, le tuesto un cacho ø pan.*
(García Hortelano, *Mary Tribune*)
'a piece of bread'

(7) frpr. *lø dzi de p'astə b'øtə^m p'ka ø buli*
dəə la s'a:lsa
(transcription, Aosta Valley)
'a little bit of mushrooms'

Juxtaposition + agreement:

(8) sp. *Más me valiera una_{FSG} poca_{FSG} ayuda_{FSG}*
(Mujica Lainez, *Escarabajo*)
'a little bit of help/assistance'

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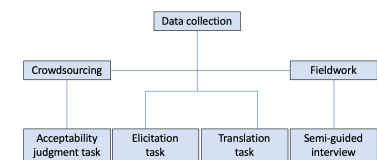
